Last year may remember the school was very fortunate to receive a grant to construct a sensory garden in front of the art building. This week I was contacted by the project manager who indicated the project would go to tender shortly and works would commence in May. This is very exciting news which will see what is currently a bit of a dust bowl developed into a very usable space for the school community.

Face Masks

This is a reminder that face masks are to be worn by parents and visitors in all school buildings. At this point parents are still not able to enter the classroom due to the imposed density limits.

Parking

Please take the time to read this important information from the City of Greater Bendigo.

The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school poses a safety concern to children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school.

Motorists must not stop in No Stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, on nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park. A number of schools have short term time restricted areas, such as 2 minute pick up drop off. These parking areas are in place to allow for ease of access close to schools and these restrictions must be adhered to. Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.

With regard to children's crossings, the law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.

City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police do conduct random patrols throughout the school year at various locations to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules.

Thank you everyone for your patience with our new at home reading program. We have been excited to see some students already log some nights of reading for the week. Please send through any questions and we will help you understand the program further.

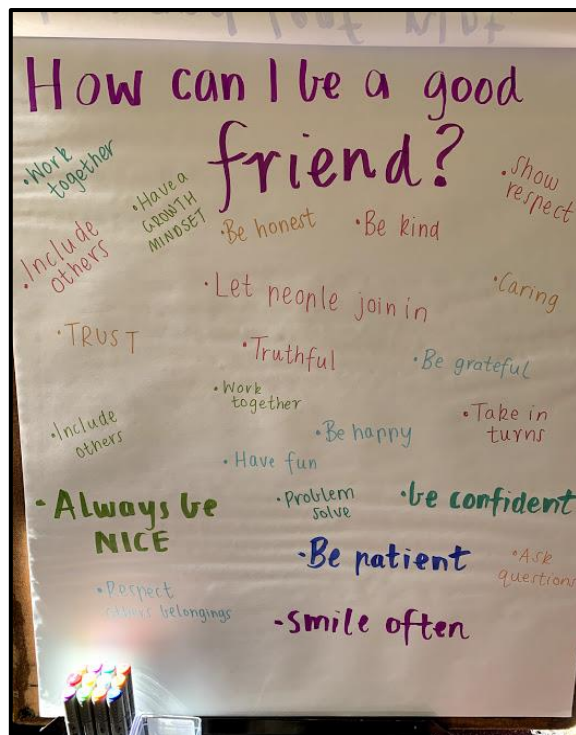
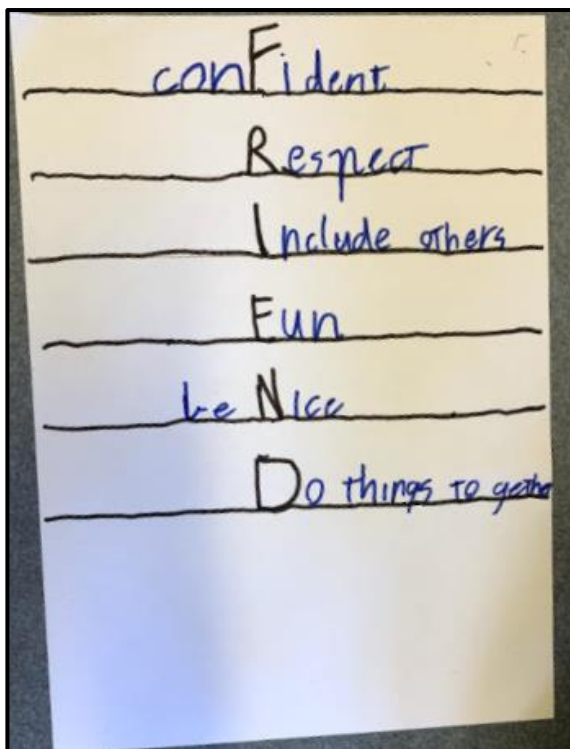
Questions asked

Ages are calculated as at December 31st 2021 e.g. a child who turns 11 at any time during 2021 will compete in the 11 years event. Children must be turning 9 or 10 in 2021 to be eligible for the 9-10 years event. Children must be born in the years 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 or 2012 to be eligible to compete.

Each competitor may enter only two individual events, one relay and one medley relay.

State Trials For All Sports

Please see the information below for those interested.

School Sport Victoria will once again be offering the opportunity for students with emerging talent from your school community to register to trial for school sport Team Vic teams in 2021.

Registrations to trial will be opening very soon and remain open until Monday 1 March, 2021 for Team Vic Big 5 teams: 12 years and under Boys Australian Football, 12 years and under Boys Basketball, 12 years and under Girls Basketball, 12 years and under Boys Cricket, 12 years and under Boys Football (Soccer) and 12 years and under Netball.

Please note that registration to trial for these teams is limited to 3 students from your school. If there are more students than 3 seeking endorsement it is up to the school Principal to ensure a selection process is undertaken to choose the students most appropriate in 2021.

These are not Come 'n' Try opportunities. They are a process for selecting a Team Vic State Team going to School Sport Australia National Championships.

Attached are supporting documents to assist your school community in understanding the process for registration including:

1. Team Vic Big 5 process [letter for parents and teachers](#)
2. Team Vic Big 5 nomination [letter to parents](#) (for a maximum of 3 students per team)

A minor change to the process for 2021 is:

- a. 12 years and under Girls Australian Football will be offered. All nominees will go direct to State Trials.
- b. 12 years and under Girls Football (Soccer) will not be required to go through stages of selection. All nominees will go direct to State Trials.

In endorsing your students your school is also committing to being a financial member of School Sport Victoria member for 2021. Further details around School Sport Victoria school membership and fees for 2021 will be distributed to schools in February 2021.

In addition to the Big 5 Team Vic sports, other sports available to primary school aged students this year within the Team Vic program include (eg. swimming, touch football and track & field). Registration details for these sports will be available on the School Sport Victoria website.

SHORT CIRCUS

A bit of a repeat of last week's news; Short Circus is now in its 33rd year! We are so fortunate to offer Short Circus as an extracurricular program at Camp Hill. Enrolments for the Short Circus are complete. All students have had a choice of at least one circus activity. Senior students get priority and get two choices. Short Circus is 'opt in' and not compulsory but most classroom teachers prefer that their students 'have a go'. Short Circus is held on Fridays and students come out of their classes to attend their chosen circus activity. Class teachers modify learning programs to work around it. Once students enrol they must remain committed to their skill area for the whole year. This means facing a physical challenge and developing resilience along the way. A commitment is expected of all the Short Circus members to stick with circus for the whole year. The costume requirements will be made as easy as possible to achieve in the coming weeks. In Term 3 the Grade 3-6's have a break, or they may volunteer as coaches for the Grade 1-2 circus skills workshops.

Short Circus members have the opportunity to audition for the Short Circus All Stars in Term 2. 25 Students who have excellent circus skills and good group skills are selected to be a part of Allstars. The Allstars perform in and around the community and at special events. 2021 here we come.

LOTE – LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

You might have already heard our kids talking about making a poster to welcome the Year of the Ox and wishing the golden ox to bring good luck and good health to us. When is the Lunar New Year 2021? Lunar New Year, also commonly referred to as Chinese New Year, starts on Friday February 12. Chinese New Year is China's most important traditional festival, with many interesting customs. Our students are very curious about why the Chinese do what they do during the Chinese New Year.

Prep to Two: Students read a Chinese New Year story called 'Legend of Monster Nian' and learn that the Monster Nian is afraid of three things: fire, loud noises and the colour red. We discuss why Chinese people set off firecrackers, watch the dragon dance with loud noises on the street, wear red clothes and give red envelopes to the children. If the children ask you 'Is the monster real?' 'Will the monster come to Bendigo?' you could tell them 'Don't worry, you have made the red envelope and it will bring good luck to you and wish you good health'.

Grade Three to Five: Students further discuss what the red envelope is and why the Chinese parents give their children red envelopes inside with lucky money. They then design their own unique red envelopes with lucky symbols for the Chinese New Year using Chinese lucky colours and wish for a prosperous new year.

Grade Six: Students share their prior knowledge of Chinese New Year with the class and demonstrate that they are very knowledgeable about the Chinese New Year while doing a quiz online. They then work on making their own book to introduce the Chinese New Year to their buddies in Prep, using their research skills, summarising skills and writing skills.
