# **CHILD SAFE STANDARDS**

# The Child Safe Standards at a glance

The seven Child Safe Standards are compulsory minimum standards for all organisations that provide services to children including Victorian schools. The aim of the Standards is to ensure organisations are well prepared to protect children from abuse and neglect

To implement the minimum Standards in accordance with Ministerial Order No. 870 - Child



Safe Standards - Managing the risk of child abuse in schools, Camp Hill PS will always take account of the diversity of all children, including (but not limited to) the needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, children with disabilities, and children who are vulnerable; and make reasonable efforts to accommodate such diversity.

Standard 4: Screening, supervision, training and other human resources practices that reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing personnel.

### What does this mean?

All personnel at Camp Hill PS have a non-delegable duty of care obligation that we owe to our students and members of the school community who visit and use the school premises. 'Duty of care' is a legal obligation that requires

schools to take reasonable steps to reduce the risk of reasonably foreseeable

Our school has developed policies and procedures and training to manage common risks in the school environment, including:

- Duty of Care
- **Bullying Prevention**
- Camps and Excursions
- First Aid
- Child Safe Standards
- **Emergency Management**
- Volunteers
- **Visitors**
- Working with Children and Suitability Checks for employment
- Mandatory Reporting
- Occupational Health and Safe

School staff, parents, carers and students are encouraged to speak to the principal to raise any concerns about risks or hazards at our school, or our duty of care obligations.




