

#### **Lunch Orders**






### **Book week**

'OLD WORLDS, NEW WORLDS, AND OTHER WORLDS'. Students can dress up and bring a book in to share!


Unfortunately, with COVID restrictions we will not be able to have a whole school parade or parents attending.

### **Camp Norval**

### LOTE

### Prep

Students enthusiastically discussed what they have known about giant pandas, such as the family, appearance, habitat, and diet of giant pandas. They found out some fun facts about giant pandas. We used different kinds of measurements to help the kids to understand how heavy, how tall, how big pandas are and how much they can eat daily. The kids were very curious about baby pandas and it was hard for them to believe that when the baby pandas are born they are as long as a pencil and as heavy as four glue sticks, considering pandas are 'giant'. They also enjoyed drawing and writing about their pandas.

#### **Grade One and Two**

Students discussed the differences between the written form in Chinese language and English. They learnt that Chinese people use symbols called hanzi to represent words. They learnt about the origin of the word big in Chinese and practiced writing big and small in Chinese and used these two adjective words to describe different animals.

#### **Grade Three and Four**

Students learnt how to introduce their birthdays and grades in Chinese and interviewed each other in Chinese.

#### **Grade Five and Six**

Students learnt about some general information such as location, population, area, population density about Guangzhou, the city that most miners came from during the Australian gold rush period. They also virtually explored the yum cha culture of Cantonese and the early Chinese immigrants' life in Victoria through tracing the Victorians' passion for Chinese cuisine.

### Nimbus Clouds

Students in Grades 1 and 2 have been studying Earth and Space Science for their class topic and looking at changes in the sky and landscape. ### **HEALTHY EATING**

#### EAT SMART/BE SMART

Did you know that two recent Australian studies have linked healthy eating to higher Naplan scores? Students who ate vegetables every night achieved NAPLAN scores that were an average 86 points higher in writing than those who steered clear of their greens.

Eating vegetables had a significant impact on students' performance in all areas of the NAPLAN test, except for numeracy.

Children should be eating at least five serves of vegetables a day and two serves of fruit.

Remember to pack or help your child to pack a healthy lunch everyday so they can learn, play and stay focussed all day at school.



These foods should NOT be brought to school because of their poor nutritional value: all lollies, chocolate, chips, twisties, cheezels etc.
