PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Virtual Remembrance Day Service

Today the school recognised this contribution of service man and women through a virtual Remembrance Day service led by our School Captains. At this service students were asked to reflect on the sacrifices made by those who fought in the First and other theatres of War.

Assessment and Reporting Day

Just a reminder that Monday 15th November is an assessment and report writing day for teachers. Students will not be required to attend on this day. The Out of School Hours Care program will be operating between the hours of 8.30am and 5.55pm, parents can book their children into the program through the normal channels.

Class Placement Information

On Tuesday we asked each child in the school to nominate a friendship list of 5 people with whom they would like to be in a grade with next year. All students are guaranteed to be with at least one friend. The current year level teaching teams are constructing classes based on academic distribution, learning styles and friendships. We take an enormous amount of time and effort to get it right and parents will receive their child's grade placement on Monday 13th December. There will be <u>no</u> opportunity to move students from their 2022 classes.



Class Structure 2022

The following class structure will be in place for 2022:

- 2 straight Prep classes
- 3 classes with a combination of Year one and Year two students
- 4 classes with a combination of Year three and Year four students

The rest of the classes will be straight years: 5 and 6. There are two classes in each year level.

Vaccination requirements for visitors and volunteers performing work in schools

Visitors and volunteers performing work on school sites (both inside and outdoors) must have had at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine and must have had two doses of COVID-19 vaccine by 29th November 2021 or have a valid medication exception. Before undertaking volunteer work, parents must present at the office with evidence of their vaccination status, either in hard copy or electronically. Once sighted the vaccination status will be recorded and parents will not be required to produce evidence of vaccination status again.

Visitors and volunteers must adhere to COVID Safety requirements including physical distancing, density limits, face mask requirements and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene.

Parents and carers who enter school buildings must also have had at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine and must have had two doses of COVID-19 vaccine by 29 November 2021 or have a valid medical exception with the following limited exceptions:

- when attending to administer medical treatment to their own child when the treatment cannot be administered by the school
- when attending to collect their child who is unwell and cannot leave the school building unaccompanied by their parent/carer.
- when attending for a momentary period that does not involve any sustained contact with staff or students, for example, to collect a completed art project or similar.

Parents and carers attending any event or activity inside a school building including, but not limited to tours, graduations, kindergarten transition, whole of school events are required to show evidence of vaccination. Meetings and other discussions (such as Student Support Group meetings) with parents and carers who do not meet vaccination requirements will be held virtually.


Emotional Intelligence

PERFORMING ARTS

What's new this week?

All classes are learning a song and choreographing a dance based on a Music genre from the 20th Century.
