## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### School Athletics Carnival

Unfortunately, we had to cancel our athletics carnival due to bad weather, this was disappointing to our middle and senior students. The new date will be Thursday 28th July in Term 3. Fingers crossed the weather is kind to us.

### Rapid Antigen Testing

Although not in large numbers we are still experiencing cases of COVID-19 across the school. I would encourage families to continue a routine of rapid antigen testing as a preventative measure so that positive cases can be detected early.

### Early Dismissal

Next Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June marks the end of Term 2, students will be dismissed at 2.30pm on that day, could parents please make arrangements for student pick-up at that time.

### Art Room Up-Date

It had been planned to have the art room reinstated today, however due to the degree of difficulty in negotiating the QEO carpark, with four sections of a sizeable building, a decision was made by the site supervisor to postpone the installation until Monday of next week. This will see the sections of the building moved on-site over the weekend ready for installation on Monday. This should not cause any disruption to the QEO carpark and at this stage the temporary fencing will remain in place with students still able to access the playground through the main gates.

## Why numeracy is important?

This year our school, like others across the state, are focusing on improving numeracy outcomes for our students. I thought I would share a few reasons why numeracy is important.

Numeracy is more than numbers. For example, numeracy helps us:

- understand and use numbers and other mathematical ideas in everyday life
- recognise and use shape
- work out the chance of something happening
- understand the data we see in the media.

Numeracy is necessary for everyday living. From daily activities like telling the time, cooking and setting the table to more difficult tasks such as understanding mobile phone plans, planning a trip, reading a map and understanding timetables.

As children and young people move through life stages the everyday numeracy demands become more complex. Employers see numeracy as important in the workplace. Research shows that higher numeracy skills lead to higher levels of health and wellbeing and other benefits such as better decision making and financial independence.

### Camp Hill Primary School 'Bringing Up Great Kids'

Have you ever thought about wanting new ways to help your child cope with the ups and downs of life? To teach your child about strong feelings and how they can manage them better? To learn about parent approaches to remaining calm when feelings get stressful in your family? these feelings skills are very important to help children make and keep friends, do well at school and feel good about themselves.



Parents and carers of children at Camp Hill Primary School have an opportunity in Term 3 2022 to participate in 'Bringing Up Great Kids', a free parent program. This six week program will run during Term 3 on Thursday mornings from 9.30am -11.00am at the school. The first session will start on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> July. The program will be facilitated by Mark Lees, Camp Hill's Student Wellbeing worker.

#### Overview

Bringing Up Great Kids is a reflective, mindful, respectful program that provides parents with an opportunity to reflect on their parenting journey.

Bringing Up Great Kids provides a friendly and safe environment for parents to learn from each other as they continue their parenting journey.

## Program Content

The Bringing Up Great Kids' program supports parents and carers to:

- learn more about the origins of their own parenting style and how it can be more effective.
- identify the important messages they want to convey to their children and how to achieve this.
- learn more about brain development in children and its influence on their thoughts, feelings and behaviour;
- understand the meaning behind children's behaviours, and how to respond to children's underlying feelings and needs.
- explore new ways of communicating with children.
- discover ways for parents to take care of themselves and to find support when they need it.

Feedback from previous programs indicate that Bringing Up Great Kids is a valuable parenting experience, independent evaluation of the program by Deakin University found that "that parents reported a significant reduction in parental stress, a decrease in family conflict, significant increase in parent confidence and very high levels of satisfaction with the program".
