

#### **NAPLAN**

Well done to our Grade 5 students who have now finished their NAPLAN testing. Across two weeks, they participated in the Numeracy, Reading, Writing and Language Conventions tests. We were very proud of the way the students conducted themselves, demonstrating the school value of confidence.

#### **Inquiry**

The Senior classes are well underway in their inquiry research project. This term we have been investigating what it means to be well/healthy. We have looked at a range of different elements of wellness and the services in Bendigo that help to support health. Students are investigating lots of different facilities, such as Dogs Connect who support the emotional wellbeing of students in Bendigo, Physiotherapists who support the physical health of people and Foodbank who support financial wellbeing.
