PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Victorian Budget 2023/24 - Funding Announcement

Last week I received a letter from the Honorable Natalie Hutchins MP Minister for Education informing the school community of a \$4.1 million budget allocation to replace the relocatable classrooms currently located on the basketball court with permanent facilities. This represents part of a \$24 million School Upgrade Delivery Fund to expand and modernize Victoria's school system.

Planning is the critical first stage of every capital works project, the school will now begin an Asset Management Plan, a 5-year plan to ensure the school's maintenance and upgrade needs, along with the capital works project, align with the school's vision for the future. Once complete the plan will move into the construction phase with funding being allocated in a future state budget.

Parent feedback from the current parent survey will help to inform the planning for this capital works project.


Ladies Morning Cuppa & Muffin
