RIGHTS, RESILIENCE AND RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS (RRRR)

RRRR's in the 3/4 Department Topic 4

This week in RRRR, 3/4 students are learning about problem solving. Students have been developing an understanding that different problems require different types of problem solving strategies.

Some of the solutions students discussed include:

- Taking turns
- Making a plan
- Asking an adult
- Finding an alternative game or activity
- Compromising
- Telling someone how you feel
- Asking someone to help you
- Using a game to work out who goes first (such as 'rock, paper, scissors')
- Asking them to stop
- Talking it over with a friend
- Asking your parent or carer to help you.

WELLBEING MATTERS - NEW CHILD SAFE STANDARDS



The Child Safe Standards (the Standards) commenced in Victoria in January 2016. After five years, it was evident that the Standards improved safety for children and young people. Changes were made to make the Standards even stronger in July 2022. The new Standards set out minimum requirements and outline the actions organisations must take to keep children and young people safe. They provide more clarity for organisations and are more consistent with Standards in the rest of Australia. There are now eleven Child Safe Standards and our school has enhanced our processes and policies to not only comply with the standards but to strengthen the actions we embed into our school organisation to ensure the safety of all children in our care.

Victoria's Child Safe Standards

- **Child Safe Standard 1** – Establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.
- **Child Safe Standard 2** – Ensure that child safety and wellbeing are embedded in school leadership, governance and culture.
- **Child Safe Standard 3** – Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.
- **Child Safe Standard 4** – Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.
- **Child Safe Standard 5** – Equity is upheld and diverse needs are respected in policy and practice.
- **Child Safe Standard 6** – People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.
- **Child Safe Standard 7** – Ensure that processes for complaints and concerns are child focused.
- **Child Safe Standard 8** – Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.
- **Child Safe Standard 9** – Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.
- **Child Safe Standard 10** – Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.
- **Child Safe Standard 11** – Policies and procedures that document how schools are safe for children, young people and students.
- Ministerial Order 1359 provides the framework for child safety in schools.

The Green Team collects the schools E-Waste and takes it to the Eaglehawk Recycling centre at the end of each semester. E-waste includes computers, mobile phones, all battery powered and electrical items. E-waste is dangerous when it is added to Landfill. Recycling e-waste keeps toxic materials out of landfill where they can contaminate the soil and groundwater. E-waste contains valuable resources.

'E-waste (electronic waste) is growing 3 times faster than any other waste stream. E-waste contains potentially hazardous and valuable materials, which don't belong in landfill. To help protect our environment and recover more precious resources, the Victorian Government has banned all e-waste from landfill as of 1 July 2019. That means e-waste can't go in any household bin.' Sustainability Victoria

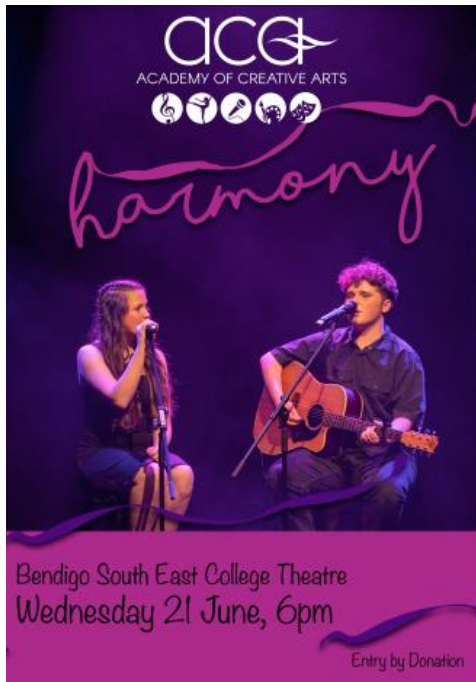
