



ATTEDS

RIGHTS, RESILIENCE AND RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS (RRRR)



Learning activities within this topic focus on building an understanding of the effects of gender-based violence and focus on the standards associated with respectful relationships. Students develop the skills needed to solve problems, set boundaries within relationships, and play an active role within the prevention of gender-based violence. They develop peer support and help-seeking skills that can be applied in response to situations involving gender-based violence in family, peer, community or on-line relationships.

Discussion points for at home with your child:

- What are some respectful and fair ways of working out who can join in a ball game?
- What are some strategies we can use if we are in an uncomfortable situation?

Activities to practise with your child:

Foundation-Grade 3

Remember students of our NO, GO, TELL strategy for when they are feeling uncomfortable.

NO Ask:

• Who knows how to say no? (Everyone)

 When do you say no?
(To tell people to stop doing something, or to tell someone that they didn't want to do something.)

'No' is a very important word and that is why we learn it so early in our lives. We can say NO if someone wants us to do something that makes us feel uncomfortable.

When we feel this kind of uncomfortable it might even give us a strange sick feeling in our tummy or a lumpy feeling in our throat. If we can, we say NO if someone is trying to hurt us or touch us in ways we do not want to be touched.

Grades 4-6

Grades 4-6 focus on a more in depth version of the No, GO, TELL strategy. Adding the CHANGE section at the end. Discuss each of these steps and scenarios where they may need to use them.

GO

GO means I can move away. I can find a safe place to go. I can do this to get away from a scary person, or to get away from someone who might hurt me, or making me feel uncomfortable about my body.

TELL

TELL means I can tell someone what has happened. I can tell someone how I feel. I can tell a safe grown up if someone is hurting my body or wanting to touch private parts of my body.

NO, GO, TELL, CHANGE MODEL


Step one: Say 'NO' or make clear you do not like what is happening. (Skip this step if it is not safe to stick around and say this.)

Step two: 'GO' – get away from the situation – walk, run, get yourself somewhere safe, switch off the device etc. Go directly to this step if it is not safe to say NO.

Step three: 'TELL' a trusted adult about what has happened. It is not your fault if you are harassed. It is the perpetrator who did the wrong thing. They abused your rights. Keeping things to yourself can lead to things getting worse for you or for others.

Step four: Work for 'CHANGE'. That means, be part of a group that does not accept these behaviours. Be part of a group that speaks up or works with others to stand up against, or works to prevent gender-based violence.

School Sports Australia

In week 7, I will be heading to Perth to manage the Under 12 Golf team for School Sports Victoria. WA are hosting nationals this year and Victoria are set to play strong golf with many players returning from last year's championships!

Gymnastics F-6

This week students started a new unit for the next 4 weeks. F-2 students are enjoying learning new animal movements and gymnastics terms through our warm up and partner rotations. Students in F-2 might like to demonstrate some of these moves at home; straddle, tuck sit, log roll, motor bike, spin/rotations, front support, egg roll, rocking horse, bunny bucks, scorpion kick and many more. Our focus is maintaining our tight bodies, balance and developing controlled landings.

Students in grades 3-6 are working with a partner to develop confidence and trust in each other through counter balances and engaging games. They are learning individual static holds such as; V-sit, arabesque, knee scale, front and rear support, candle stick, table top and scorpion stand. These fundamental static movements will develop body awareness so students can develop their own floor routine with a partner at the same ability level. Students will have three weeks to practise a floor routine before performing to their peers for a peer assessment on smooth transitions, holds, creativity and execution.
