WELLBEING MATTERS

Resilience

Resilience ... it's a familiar word, isn't it? But what does it really mean?

Resilience is the ability to cope when things go wrong. It's a child's ability to cope with ups and downs and bounce back from the challenges they experience during childhood. Building resilience helps children not only to deal with current difficulties that are a part of everyday life, but also to develop the basic skills and habits that will help them deal with challenges later in life, during adolescence and adulthood.

As a parent or carer, you can help to develop essential skills, habits and attitudes for building resilience at home by helping your child to:

- build good relationships with others including adults and peers
- build their independence
- learn to identify, express and manage their emotions
- build their confidence by taking on personal challenges

Parents play a really important part in their modelling and approach during stressful times. Children learn and take cues from the adults around them. Being mindful of how we approach stressful situations and the skills we use to resolve challenges is essential in helping our children develop resilience. Parents can also play an active role in supporting children during stressful times by facilitating problem-solving steps to work through situations positively. Over time, these skills can then be developed by the child, so they are able to more independently resolve difficulties. Talking about what happened afterwards can also help to reinforce the learning and remind the child that things can turn out okay even when it's been a bit stressful.




Accounts

Gymnastics

All students from Foundation to Grade 6 have spent the last 4 weeks enthusiastically participating in our gym unit for Physical Education. Students have developed their confidence when working both individually and with a partner to complete static holds, execute tucks, turns and rolls. Our focus has been on developing and checking for 'tight bodies'. They have tested their own strength and stability in many pre-requisites activities that are needed to progress safely at their own pace through each level.

Students in grades 3-6 are creating a routine performance with a partner who is of matched ability. Their routines were presented in front of their class as a peer assessment. Each routine demonstrated their understanding of how to link static holds into smooth transitions, using their memory and balance.

School Sports Victoria Golf

On Sunday 12th November, I flew to Perth with the Under 12yrs Victorian Golf Team for the School Sports Australia Championship. The team consisted of 8 boys and 4 girls who played in the 3 day competition at National level on some of the most magical golf courses of offer in WA. The students were selected to represent Victoria after an 18 hole trial at Gisborne. All players managed themselves exceptionally during our week-long trip. These 12 kids can seriously swing a club, celebrating Eagles, Birdies and watching all kids record a par on most holes is outstanding. Our boys team were the successful 1st place winners of the combined stroke events and together with our girls total we finished in 2nd place overall. Taking home the Craig Parry Cup was a fantastic result for Victoria as it has been 10 years since winning this title. If your child loves mingling with adults and avoids contact sports, junior golf might be an option for your whole family. Golf teaches students to manage their emotions on and off the course. Children also develop a unique etiquette from playing golf for a local club, they then take this into their everyday lives.
