Student Reports

Grade Placements For 2024

Today parents will receive a letter identifying their child's class placement and teacher for 2024. Class lists have been double-checked to ensure every student has at least one friend in their new class, so please remember, your child's initial apprehensions can be greatly reduced by conversations and reassurances by an adult. There will be **no** opportunity for changes to class placements.

Whole School Assembly

Friday 15th December will be the last whole school assembly for 2023, parents and friends are more than welcome to attend.

Grade 6 Graduation

The Grade 6 graduation ceremony will be held on Thursday 14th December in the James King Hall Bendigo Senior Secondary School, commencing at 6.00pm. The school community is invited to attend this milestone event for our most senior students.



Statewide Orientation Day

Next Tuesday 12th December is the State-Wide Orientation Day, where our students in Grade 6 have the opportunity to visit their secondary school. Transitioning to a new school can be quite an anxious time, so it's important to try and allay any anxiety by talking through concerns with your child before the day. Here at Camp Hill our new Foundation students will come for the morning and during that time will meet their Grade 6 buddy for 2024.

New Class Day

As part of the school's transition program, next Tuesday (Statewide Orientation Day), students will have the opportunity to spend time in their 2024 classroom and to meet their new teacher. The purpose of the visit will be to provide students time to orientate themselves to the new classroom geographically and to begin building relationships with the teacher and fellow classmates.



Last Day Dismissal

Students will be **dismissed on the last day of school at 12.30pm**, this will allow for a recess break and two, ninety minute teaching blocks. As is the tradition at Camp Hill, the students and staff who are leaving our school will pass under the Arch of Honour, this will commence at 12.15pm with the school assembling on the covered area at the rear of the school.

First Day Term 1 2024

The first day for students in Grades 1-6 will be Tuesday 30th January 2024, with Foundation classes commencing on Friday 2nd February. As was the case last year, parents will have the opportunity to book an interview for Tuesday 30th January, with the 2024 classroom teacher. Students should also attend with their books. There will be no expectation for students to wear their uniform at the interview. Normal classes will commence on Wednesday 31st January.

Mobile Phone Ban

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours. The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year. The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state. This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions. By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause. I ask for the support of all our families, staff, and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.

Further information

Exceptions: For a small number of students with particular health needs, an exception to the policy may be granted. Please contact Chris Barker if you would like to discuss this.

Emergencies: In the event of an emergency or if you need to immediately contact your child, I ask that families contact the school office who will pass on a message as required.

School mobile phone policy: A copy of our school's local mobile phone policy, which implements the government's mobile policy in line with our local context, is available on the school's website.

Parent support: The Mobile phones in school's webpage provides links to resources for families to help them balance their children's time using mobile phones.

WELLBEING MATTERS

CYBERSAFETY

With increased access to, and use of technology for education and social purposes, the issue of cybersafety is something we all need to be aware of.

Some useful tips for parents to manage their child's time on devices and make it safe include:

- talk to your child about staying safe on the internet
- · monitor children's time online, particularly younger children
- set house rules what's okay to do and what's not, how much time is 'online' time and what kind of personal information is okay to make public
- · use filters or other technological tools to help limit exposure to potentially harmful or distressing material
- find out what children are up to, create your own accounts and play with the services/games/apps they are using so that you become familiar with them
- model the kind of positive online behaviour you would like them to use.




Last Day Of Term Care

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What is OSHC?

OSHC is a form of childcare available to all parents or guardians of primary school aged children in the Camp Hill community. Camp Hill PS OSHC is a national accredited service.

We were accredited through the new system developed by Australian Childcare Education & Care Quality Authority - 'ACECQA .

We currently operate Before School Care and After School Care

Cost

The Cost for Before School Care is \$22.00 a session full cost and can be as little as \$3.95 with subsidy.

The cost of After School Care is \$24.00 a session at full cost. However, payments may vary for each family and can be as little as \$3.95 a session. Families can contact the Centrelink office on 136150 to enquire as to whether they are eligible for the Childcare subsidy. Once your child is enrolled, we will be able to confirm the cost for you.
